Finance Director Chris Black advised he distributed an informational sheet about today's bond sales for refunding and he explained in detail about the outcome for each series; 2014A, 2014B and 2014C.

Dan Forbes, Speer Financial, reported very good news on the outcome of today's bond sale and provided the aldermen with a summary report reflecting the refunding resulted in nominal debt service savings of \$616,656.26, worth \$533,762.26 on a net present value basis or 5.546% of refunded principal.

Alderman Hervey asked if the downgraded bond rating the City received a few months ago impacted the bond sale.

Dan Forbes reported investors did not express concerns about the bond rating.

Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Rockford, Winnebago and Ogle Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. The Bonds as defined in the Preambles to this Resolution shall be executed by the officials of the City in the manner and form as provided for in and by the ordinances authorizing the Bonds, and the Bonds shall have such terms as are provided in the Offers.

Section 2. The officials of the City are hereby ordered and directed to have the Bonds prepared for delivery to the Purchasers. Upon execution thereof, the Bonds shall be deposited with the Comptroller and be by him or her delivered to the Purchasers, upon receipt of the applicable purchase prices therefor, being the prices as shown in the Offers plus accrued interest, if any, to the date of delivery, in accordance with the terms of the Offers as entered into by and between the Purchasers and the City.

Section 3. It is hereby found and declared that no person holding any office of the City, either by election or appointment, is in any manner financially interested, either directly, in his or her own name, or indirectly in the name of any other person, association, trust or corporation, in the contract so confirmed in this Resolution to the Purchasers for the purchase and sale of the Bonds.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.
